# THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS RESOURCES:

**Contact your local bishop/branch president** to find out about your local availability and how to get connected.

Don't know your bishop/branch president? Find one with a congregation near you: <u>maps.churchofjesuschrist.org</u>

- Bishop's Storehouses: food
- Family Services: professional counseling
- **Deseret Industries:** clothing, furniture, employment services, etc.
- <u>Self-reliance Programs</u>: finance management, career advancement, etc.
- **Wards/branches:** baby needs, religious counseling, financial support, housing/employment, etc. (as determined by local leaders)
  - Social, emotional, and other temporal support may be available through members of your local ward/branch (Relief Society sisters, elders quorum brothers, bishopric).

#### **COMMUNITY RESOURCES:**

- **Pregnancy Resource Centers:** adoption referrals, baby supplies, diapers, ultrasounds/medical care, parenting classes, etc.
  - There are about 3000 PRCs (also called crisis pregnancy centers) across the USA. Services vary by location but may include above list.

- National Diaper Bank: diapers

#### **GOVERNMENT RESOURCES:**

- County Health Departments: classes, formula, food, medical, etc.
  - Each county typically has its own health department, and most health departments offer help with setting up emergency pregnancy medical care (Baby Your Baby), Medicaid, and WIC. Many offer birthing/parenting classes, and some even have staff that will come to your home for additional help.
- Federal Government: financial aid, food, medical
  - Sign up for Food Stamps, Welfare, and/or Medicaid, if you apply.

- State Government: immediate/emergency financial help
